



HOLY RESURRECTION ORTHODOX CHURCH

Limited Attendance: Indoor Weekly Services

With the blessing of His Eminence, Archbishop Benjamin, and with thanks to God, we are pleased to announce the gradual reopening of Holy Resurrection Orthodox Church in Tacoma.

1. Phase 2 in Pierce County allows for 25% occupancy for indoor services, not including staff (clergy, cantor, etc.) This amounts to a little over 40 people inside our church.

2. Weekly indoor services will include Vespers and weekday Divine Liturgies.

3. Antidoron will not be offered at Divine Liturgy, you may want to bring some bread from home to help wash down Communion.

4. We will continue to commemorate all the names in all the commemoration books stored at the church at the preparation of the bread and wine, the Proskomide.

5. We request that you take your temperatures before attending a service. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4°F should not come! Anyone with a household member who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 or with symptoms

of COVID-19 (including a fever above 100.4°F) should not come!

6. **Face coverings must be worn** by those in attendance, unless they are very young or have breathing difficulties.

7. As in all public places these days, we ask that everyone present practice social distancing.

8. People considered to be "high risk," those over 65 and people of any age who have serious underlying medical conditions are cautioned not to come. His Eminence has blessed us to distribute Holy Communion during the week by appointment from the reserve Holy Gifts (on the church porch) to the faithful in these categories, please watch for more information about this. People in these categories are not forbidden to attend! Just be cautious!

We will distribute Communion to parishioners in the above high risk categories by appointment on designated days, please contact Fr. John Pierce for an appointment.

9. We need volunteers to

help clean the facilities between services. Please contact Fr. John if you would like to volunteer for a cleaning crew.

If you are uncomfortable with these provisions, you may not wish to come to church.

The situation is not ideal, but thanks be to God things are beginning to change. We look forward to seeing one another! Glory to God for all things!
